MESSAGE FROM THE VICAR OF THE CATHEDRAL

My dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Saviour!

Church: On the 6th of August, the Church observes the feast of the Transfiguration. One of the most simple and profound stories that this feast teaches us through the life and teaching of Jesus is that our "mountain top" experiences provide us with the necessary springboard to live the life God calls us to live in the valley, where life is lived amidst many challenges.

This lesson is such an important one for us given the living reality we are confronted with. Therefore, may we continue to draw our inspiration and courage to live as the people of God.

Nation: The trials and travails of the nation continue to impact the people of the nation like a rash! The education system lies in chaos with school teachers and school heads locking horns with the government in trade union agitation. There seems to be no coordination between all those who are managing the health crisis. The plight of our farmers who are agitating for their basic requirements so that they may engage in their profession should not just be seen as an agitation, their actions can have a telling impact on food production in the country.

Meanwhile, while those in authority who sight the health crisis and question the timings of all these agitations may appear to have some merit in their claim, it must not be forgotten that harsh fuel hikes, the rushing through of certain legislations and the decision to place orders for vehicles for our legislators for instance are also taking place in the backdrop of the health crisis. Therefore, these short-sighted, poor and insensitive decisions of our leaders have exposed the gross disconnect between those in leadership and the people.

Leaders who would aspire to call themselves statesmen must rise above all this and place the needs and the welfare of their people before themselves, where the TRUTH is the biggest casualty. But then alas, our nation seems to be inundated by a group of self-seeking politicians who are far from being the statesmen that is our nation's need of the hour!

Let him who possesses a field, so partake of its yearly fruits, that he may suffer the ground to be injured by his negligence, but let him endeavour to hand it down to posterity as he received it, or even better cultivated. Moreover, that this economy, and this diligence, with respect to those good things which God has given us to enjoy, may flourish among us; let everyone regard himself as the steward of God in all things which he possesses."

Dominion properly exercised, drives us back to God. Humans are continually interacting with creation in our daily activities, from driving to an office, growing food in the soil or catching fish in rivers, lakes and the ocean. God created the physical, biological processes on this earth, and effective dominion requires us to gain knowledge of how these systems work or risk ruining them through overuse or by polluting them so they cannot function properly.

Agrarian writer and farmer Wendell Berry writes, "The care of the earth is our most ancient and most worthy and, after all, our most pleasing responsibility. To cherish what remains of it, and to foster its renewal, is our hope."

Dominion over creation was given to humanity as our vocation, and we joyfully exercise this dominion in accord with God's purposes, providing for all that God has made.

AN APPEAL TO THE CATHEDRAL WORSHIPPING COMMUNITY TO REPLENISH CATHEDRAL DEFICITS

I hope this communication finds you relatively safe and well in the challenging COVID situation we all find ourselves in.

We at the Cathedral have done our utmost for over the past one year to ensure that we stay engaged with you in many ways thanks to the technical support of committed members, staff, choir, other volunteers in general and indeed our clergy. Our Sunday services have proceeded uninterrupted online and you will appreciate the level of extra planning and effort that this entails. Likewise our Sunday school children have had the benefit of interactive sessions thanks to a small team of dedicated volunteer teachers and technical support persons. Home visits to those in need have proceeded unabated in order that Pastoral interventions are made at critical times. More recently the virtual group discussions or the time of Fellowship online under the theme "**Church Reimagined**" for the Worshipping Community was revived to facilitate a time of fellowship for as many in these trying conditions we all live in today.

We assure you that the Cathedral will continue with these efforts whatever the circumstances that evolve in the times ahead.

Whilst we give you that commitment we would be faulted if we did not bring to your attention the dire state of our financial situation which is deteriorating alarmingly month by month. This has of course been precipitated by our inability to provide you our members the opportunities to conveniently make your customary regular offerings.

We have just completed the annual audit for the year 2020/21 and the resultant financial statements will shortly be presented to you ahead of the forthcoming AGM. These statements show that we have understandably run a deficit of nearly **Rs.2.5m** during the year!

You will appreciate that though we are constrained in our ability to have physical services and receive your offerings, we continue to serve our worshipping community diligently and a consequence of this is that our regular overhead costs of Rs.1m per month (both statutory and other) need to be met. The deficit is a consequence and is accumulating month-on-month.

We have thus far survived this challenge only because of the outreach funds that are available to us and these are on the verge of being fully depleted. These funds were raised to support very worthy causes. Rest assured though that our outreach commitments have been fully met to date without interruption and we hope to keep it that way. Though these funds have been a temporary lifeline for us over the last year, you will appreciate that this cannot continue for long and we need to immediately take measures to replenish those reserves whilst also raising funds every month for recurring current expenditure.

We, therefore, appeal to you to help us build our reserves by contributing to

- 1. Cathedral deficit fund and
- 2. Tithes, thank offerings, donations, etc. on a regular basis.
